2016 issue. Winners receive a one year membership in MVAS. Our Autumn 2016 First Prize winner will receive a large finch feeder and a 5 lb. bag of Nyjer seed, a \$65 value graciously donated by Wild Birds Unlimited, 2001 E. Lohman Ave., Suite 130, Las Cruces.

Contest Rules: Photos submitted must have been taken in our local area, i.e., Sierra, Otero, or Dona Ana Counties only, and during this calendar year. Our publications committee will judge entries based on photo quality, subject interest, and subject variety. Our newsletter editor will make the final selection for publica-

tion. From these, one will be chosen as the First Prize winner.

By submitting your photo you automatically grant Mesilla Valley Audubon Society (MVAS) publication rights for one year. MVAS may use your photo in any of our publications, including newsletters and our annual calendar. ## Field Trips

The Mesilla Valley Audubon has lined up an exciting array of field trips this Autumn. Please look them over and contact board member Mark Pendleton (see Officers, Page 4).

**August 20:** the proposed site of the diversion of the Gila River in Cliff NM; Details of when and where to meet (it will be early as this is a bit further afield than our trips to local birding spots) will be made available via e-mail to MVAS membership.

**September 24:** In conjunction with the September program, we will visit Leasburg Dam State Park in Radium Spring, one of the better local birding hotspots. Board member C.J Goin will lead this trip. Meet at the Park Visitor Center at 8 am (take I-25 exit 19 for Radium Springs and head SW--away from Interstate. Park entrance is to the right. Ample water, insect repellent and snacks are strongly suggested.

**October 22:** We're going to A-Spear Ranch ([www.a-spear.com](http://www.a-spear.com)) on Las Palomas Creek SW

of T or C, starting at the K-Mart parking lot at 7 a.m. This 60,000-acre ranch is a private wildlife preserve. You will not believe you're in Southern New Mexico when you see this place. Mr. J.R. Absher, one of the partners in the A-Spear, will be our October program presenter.

## MVAS Beginner Bird Walks

Mesilla Valley Audubon Society Beginner Bird Walks continue August 17 and run on the third Wednesday of every month. Future dates are September 21, October 19 and November 16. Don't worry about reservations, just show up at 7:45 a.m. at the Tellbrook Park entrance, 4290 E. Winchester Road in Las Cruces. Birding will be done from the paved path that winds through the park, with short, optional excursions into the surrounding desert. Board member Wayne Treers is your guide (see Officers, Page 4).

## Feasibility study underway for community bird blind

MVAS is studying the feasibility of constructing a bird blind at Mesilla Valley Bosque State Park. The blind will be located and designed to support both recreational and educational activities, including bird watching, photography, tourism, school field trips, research, and outreach programs. MVAS is partnering with New Mexico State Parks and Friends of MV Bosque State Park to develop and maintain this important community resource.
